ORAL HISTORY PROJECT

The Phillips Community Oral History Project is a collaborative effort between Alley Communications and the United Phillips Coalition—comprising the Phillips West Neighborhood Organization (PWNO), East Phillips Improvement Coalition (EPIC), Midtown Phillips Neighborhood Association, Inc. (MPNAI), and residents across the Phillips community.

Supported by funding from the University of Minnesota's Liberal Arts Engagement Hub and the City of Minneapolis, this project seeks to document, amplify, and empower the multicultural, multi-generational voices that make up Phillips. Our goal is to ensure that community members can tell their stories, in their own words and on their own terms.

Over the next year, we'll conduct interviews with Phillips residents who will share their personal journeys—how they arrived in Phillips and their experiences as organizers, immigrants, artists, parents, teachers, health professionals, tradespeople, and more. These stories will be woven together into an interactive online experience that explores how Phillips became the vibrant community it is today.
